CCC COMPANY 380 was organized at Fort Meade, Maryland, on May 29, 1933, and on the following day the company was located on the present camp site, 10 miles southeast of Coudersport, Pennsylvania, at which site it has remained continuously.

Many outstanding work projects have been completed and many more are in progress. Included among the completed projects are the construction of 5 miles of road 34 miles of horse and fire trails for fire protection and recreational development, improvement

of seven and a half miles of forest streams for fish breeding, cleaning brush of more than 1300 acres of forest for the purpose of reducing fire hazard, covering of more than 5600 acres of forest lands by the White Pine Blister Rust Eradication Crews, stock survey of 13,116 acres of state land has been made by crews, which estimated the value of the timber on the lands, the building and maintaining of a telephone line, completion of erosion control work, erection of signs, the building of a public park, as well as a number of other miscellaneous projects.

During the third enrollment period Company 380 made an enviable record. The outstanding accomplishments include: the highest percentage of men available for forestry work; losing of the least number of man days, due to accidents, of any company in the Corps area; the lowest sick rate of any company in Sub-District No. 8; selected the outstanding company of Sub-District No. 8; selected one of the outstanding of District No. 2; selected one of the outstanding companies in the Corps area; and commended

by the Commanding General and given the general rating of "Excellent".

During the fourth enrollment period, when no selection of outstanding company was made, Company 380 enjoyed the highest percentage of men available for forestry work of any company in Pennsylvania, and again lost the least number of man days, due to accidents, of any company in the Corps Area. During the fifth enrollment period the company also enjoyed a comparatively similar high ranking in all phases.

A comprehensive educational program has been sponsored by the company for over two and a half years. A number of elementary, high school, college, and vocational courses are given, in addition to the regular recreational program and informal activities. Every man in the company is participating in the educational program.

Nicholas Yurcik, a former member of the company, received a scholarship to the Mansfield State Teachers College while a member of the company.

The camp and community relations and cooperation have been mutually beneficial and cordial.
