COMPANY 1330 WAS ORGANIZED IN JUNE 1933. The period between June 7, 1933 to June 14, 1934 identified the company as a white unit. From June 14, 1934, to the present time the company has been composed of Negro enrollees.

The company is located at Renovo, Pa., in the Sproul Forest District of Northwestern Pennsylvania, 250 miles northwest of Philadelphia, Pa.

For the most part, the work projects have been woven around road

and bridge building, and the conservation of wild life. There has also been work done along construction lines. The company has completed fire trails, telephone lines, boundary lines, linear surveys, and over 82 miles of road have been maintained.

The educational achievements of the company have been of far-reaching importance. Class enrollment and attendance has seldom fallen as low as 50 per cent.

A well organized system of counselling and guidance is a unique feature of the educational program. The forms used by the educational department for the purpose of recording information received from an enrollee during an interview are the direct result of much reading and collaboration with authorities on the subject by the adviser.

Fire fighting squads are kept intact at all times for forest fire emergency. The men are under the instruction of qualified fire wardens, and have contributed 879 man days of heroic fire fighting. Flood

relief work by the enrollees of the company in the city of Renovo was the most outstanding during the disaster of March 17, 1936. The enrollees were the first of the CCC outfits to reach the scene of the disaster, working valiently day and night to relieve human suffering and the destruction of the property of the unfortunate victims.

Invaluable community contacts have been established by the official personnel of the company since its organization for the purpose of broadening the educational and recreational programs in camp.

Several agencies outside of the camp that have contributed to the program are the Renovo High School authorities, who made a loan of 120 text books to aid in instruction, and the WPA office located in Lock Haven, Pa., which cooperated in the selection and appointment of two qualified instructors. Pennsylvania State College offers correspondence courses in agriculture and home economics without tuition, and the Renovo High School authorities have made available the school gymnasium for basketball practice.
