**CCC COMPANY 2319** is located northwest of Sheffield, Pennsylvania and is situated in what is known as the center of the Allegheny National Forest. Members of the company are engaged in the maintenance of roads, fire trails, survey of timber lands, and park improvement. The town of Sheffield is principally inhabited by people of Swedish descent, principally occupied in lumbering. The Central Pennsylvania Lumber Yards, the largest in the state, are located at Sheffield.

When the company first moved to its present location it occupied tents until August 2, 1935, when the members of the company first occupied barracks.

Field work officially began on July 2, 1935, and since that time the members of the company have completed a total of 40 projects. Of the many projects completed, are construction of 1000 linear feet of gravel walks, stocking 2000 fish in the Farnsworth and Minister Creeks, maintenance of 125 miles of fire trail roads, and boundary signs, over 17 miles of truck trails and roads, construction of three and a half acres of public picnic grounds, counting traffic on Warren Kinzua and State Road No. 4, as well as a host of other beneficial and worthwhile accomplishments.

At the present time the company is engaged in further projects. The members of the company continue the maintenance of the Sheffield Administration Site, and many roads. The enrollees are also removing trees from Morrison Run and planting them at Sheffield Administration Site, surveying timber, and carrying on stream patrol and fire preservation.

Company 2319 is not lacking in a widespread and complete educational program. One of the educational projects under way is the woodworking class, which is being conducted in the Sheffield Toy Factory. The conduct of the class in the factory is made possible by the courtesy of the owners.

The camp mimeographed newspaper, Bull Hill News, is published monthly by the journalistic class, and is another of the projects sponsored under the educational program.

Twice monthly the music department of the educational program sponsors a radio broadcast over Radio Station WOCL, Jamestown, New York.

The company has obtained the use of a large hall in Sheffield, which is used four nights a week for recreational purposes. In addition, the owner of the Utopian Theater in Sheffield has donated use of his theater for two free Sunday afternoon shows a month.

In all, the project, educational, and recreational activities provide a well-rounded life for the enrollees of the company.
